Dr. Judy Meuth, a clinical associate professor in the Department of Critical Culture, Gender and Race Studies, was a recipient of the President's Distinguished Teaching Award for Non-tenure Track Faculty at Washington State University. She was recognized March 29 during the WSU Showcase celebrating faculty, staff and student achievement.

Dr. Meuth has been a long-time supporter of Native American students and communities through numerous research projects and grants she has been involved in.

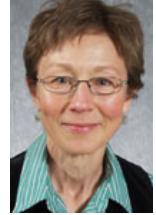
WSU Tribal Liaison Barbara Aston, has known Dr. Meuth for about 15 years.

"In these 15 years, I have witnessed Judy's contributions and continuous passion for embracing diversity and incorporating diverse perspectives into the planning and execution of curriculum and programs," says Aston.

Aston and Dr. Meuth collaborated on a number of grant projects over the years, focusing on improving opportunities for minority youth in science and technology. Several of Meuth's grant projects involved the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation, and in recent years she facilitated a work group of faculty and staff involved with research, teaching, outreach and service on the Colville Reservation.

"Grants have come and gone; what has been consistent is Judy's commitment," says Aston. "Judy has been a strong advocate and mentor for students from diverse backgrounds."
