Exploring College Emerging Leaders: Participants will receive important information regarding the application process at WSU, financial aid & scholarship overview, Native programming and resources at WSU, and more! Native faculty, college students, and members from tribal communities will lead hands on activities, cultural presentations, and college planning workshops. Students will have the opportunity to engage with Native role models and experience life on the WSU campus.

When: October 25-27, 2013

Who:

1. High School Junior or Senior interested in attending WSU
2. Minimum of a cumulative 2.75 GPA
3. Completed Application and Parental Permissions

Cost: All activities, meals, and lodging are provided AT NO COST to students accepted to the program. Students may want to bring some spending money for souvenirs at the campus Bookstore.

Housing: Students will be assigned a roommate of the same gender at a local Pullman hotel. Staff members and the EXCEL program director will also be staying at the hotel

Transportation: A charter bus will provide transportation from designated pick-up locations. Students unable to make one of those pick-up locations will need to provide their own transportation to and from Pullman, WA at their own expense.
