Price Chosen for College Board Fellowship

The Assistant Director of WSU Native American Programs Faith Price was selected in January for a College Board Professional Fellowship.

The College Board promotes college readiness and success through multiple avenues including research, educational advocacy, and perhaps most well-known, their SAT and Advanced Placement programs. The College Board Professional Fellowship Program recognizes and supports the efforts of young professionals working to close the academic achievement gap for communities of color.

"I'm thrilled to have been chosen," said Price. "What a great way to start off the new year! I'm looking forward to meeting the other fellows, and learning from my mentor."

Price was one of ten fellows selected out of over 80 applications. As a fellow, she will receive a \$5,000 award to support the work of WSU Native American Programs. In addition, she will receive mentoring from a professional in the education field, be able to attend the 2016 College Board Forum in Chicago, and benefit from the support of the cohort in the program.

"I'm excited for the opportunities this presents," said Price. "I'm excited for the knowledge I can bring back, and I'm grateful for the financial award that will make a direct impact on programming we can offer our students."

Price has been employed with WSU Native American Programs for four years. She oversees Native American undergraduate student recruitment and retention for the university. Prior to coming to Washington State University, Price spent many years working for federal TRiO programs, and in the K-12 sector in prevention and family advocacy.

Price is a descendant of the Wampanoag tribe. She grew up on the Flathead Indian Reservation in western Montana, and earned both her bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Montana in Missoula.
